### **Rules and Regulations of This Department**

1. This department is open only to bona fide 4-H and FFA members from any southern middle Tennessee or north Alabama counties.
2. Entries will be accepted at the following times: Sections 12-35 Sewing, Fun with Fashions, Art, Metal Craft, Cartooning, Birdhouses, Handicraft, Food Preservation, Photography, Record Books, and Pre-4-H: Tuesday and Wednesday 3:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. prior to fair opening. Judging will be on Thursday prior to fair opening at 9:00 a.m. Sections 1-11-Vegetables, Field Crops, Horticulture, Displays, and Home Products Friday prior to fair opening, 1:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M.; Saturday prior to fair opening 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 P.M. Judging will be first Saturday at 2:00 P.M. No entries will be accepted after 12:00 P.M. opening Saturday.
3. Exhibits will be removed on Sunday, following fair closing, from 1:00 P.M. to 2:30 P.M. Do not come before 1:00 P.M. as entries will not be released before then. Exhibits will be removed on Sunday after fair closing or will become property of the Lincoln County Fair, Inc. You are responsible for items left after 2:30 P.M. No care will be taken to protect them after Sunday.
4. A sweepstakes ribbon will be presented to the person with the most exhibits.
5. All items must be made or grown or raised by the exhibitor making the entry during the last year, unless otherwise noted. No items can be entered in a previous fair. Potted plants and hanging baskets may be entered more than 1 year. No purchased items may be entered in the field crop, vegetable, honey, and home products, display or flower show. Crafts and canning and sewing must also be completed by the exhibitor. No purchased products, except for flower arrangements.. Any 4-H, FFA member, or families not abiding by above rules may be **barred from entering anything in the fair in the future**. Discretion will be determined by the Fair Board. Fair board reserves the right to re-categorize any item not entered correctly.
6. Pre-entries are encouraged to prevent long waiting periods. Entry forms may be picked up at the Lincoln County Extension Service or may be downloaded from the fair website at [lincolncountyfairinfo.com](http://lincolncountyfairinfo.com).
7. **Premiums are 1<sup>st</sup>-\$6; 2<sup>nd</sup> -\$4; 3<sup>rd</sup> -\$2 and all credible entries \$1 unless otherwise noted. Best of Show will receive \$10.**

No soil, paper, etc. Toothpicks, wire or glue may be used to form critters, but must not be visible. Judging will be based on Originality 50% Material 30 % and Presentation 20 %.
