Emily Pitcock Elected Director of IAFE



The Tennessee Association of Fairs is honored to have two representatives on the national board of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions. Emily Pitcock and Hale Moss, both of Tennessee were elected to the Board of Directors at the IAFE Convention held in Las Vegas, Nevada, November 29-December 3.

Emily Pitcock was elected as a two-year director to represent the Federation of State and Provincial Association of Fairs of North America. Emily is the first president of this association to be elected from Tennessee. Emily is the Tennessee Association of Fairs Executive Secretary and a member of the Lincoln County Fair Board in Fayetteville, Tennessee.
