

## 2011 4-H Fun with Fashion Scenarios

The Fun with Fashion event provides a practice in consumer purchasing skills. Each participant will choose one class to enter. The majority of the outfit, including accessories, needs to be purchased with the scenario and budget in mind. Shoes do not need to be new or count in the budget. Remember to use comparison shopping to check out prices for the same or similar outfits in different stores. You may also use secondhand stores such as thrift or consignment stores, or even yard sales! Keep up with your costs and savings. These will be recorded on your data sheet.

### **Class 1: Active Sports Wear – Grades 4-5**

You and your class will be attending a field trip to an adventure camp. You will be climbing a rock wall and maneuvering through a low ropes course. Since this is a school trip, no extra short shorts or tops that show your midriff are allowed. Any straps must cover under garments. You have \$45.

### **Class 2: School Wear – Grades 4-5**

You have been selected to read your essay at a school assembly and need to select a casual outfit (pants, jeans, skirt, or dress) that looks good on you, fits well, and is appropriate for school. Pictures will be taken for the school newsletter, so you want to look your best. You have \$45 that you can spend.

### **Class 3: Best Wear – Grades 4-5**

You are attending a community- wide luncheon recognizing outstanding students from around the county. You may choose dress pants & shirt, skirt & blouse, a dress, or a suit. Choose something that is age appropriate, fits well, and is flattering. You can spend no more than \$65 on clothes & accessories.

### **Class 4: Active Sportswear – Grades 6-8**

You are planning to attend a youth lock-in at a local YMCA facility. During the lock-in, you will be allowed to play volleyball, basketball, and racket ball. You need to select athletic clothing that is comfortable and modest. Skimpy tops and very short shorts should be avoided. Spend no more than \$50.

### **Class 5: School Wear – Grades 6-8**

You have been asked to model an outfit in a Back-To-School Fashion Show sponsored by a local mall. Your job is to model an outfit that reflects current fashion trends and is appropriate for school. Clothes should look good on your body type and fit well. You have \$50 to select the outfit you want to model in the show.
